My Faith Looks Up To Thee

Psalms 121: **1** I lift up my eyes to the hills—where does my help come from? **2** My help comes from the LORD, the Maker of heaven and earth;

On October 5th, 2007, I noticed a knot on my daughter's face. My first question was who or what hit you in your face. Nykea, better known as Nike, hadn't noticed that the knot was there. I called her pediatrician and made an emergency appointment that evening. Her doctor was unable to diagnose her and she had three other doctors come into the room and none of them had an idea of what was growing inside of her face. The next step was a CT- Scan. The result from the CT- Scan did not offer any answers other than it was some kind of growth. We then went to Children's Hospital in Washington, D.C. There, Nike was seen by five different doctors before she was given a biopsy and then diagnosed with a rare tumor called Reparative Giant Cell Granuloma. The tumor had invaded three areas of her face; it went through her sinuses over her cheek and above her teeth. At Nike's appointment with two of the previous doctors and with three additional doctors, we were informed of the plan to treat her condition. We were told that the tumor will continue to grow unless removed. The removal of the tumor would totally destroy the right side of her face, require years of plastic surgery, and she would lose six teeth, her eyesight, and the ability to speak. On top of this awful news, we were told that because of the rarity of this tumor, they were unable to find any doctors at Children's or Washington Hospital Center that were willing to treat her. At that point, I began to question God, asking him "is my daughter reaping what I had sowed? Is she paying the price for some of my past sins?" Going from begging and pleading with him to healing her to being mad and confused, I then started to lose hope. I started to lose faith. I was so busy trying to find doctors to heal her that I forgot about the ultimate healer. I was broken. I went to see Nike's God-mother and she gave me two things: a hospital gown from her grandson when he was sick in the hospital when God healed him, and a scripture, Matthew 19:26. "Jesus looked at them and said "With man, this is impossible, but with God all things are possible."

Later that week, God came to me and said that I was looking in all the wrong places and all the wrong people for her healing. All I had to do was ask him and believe that he would be faithful to his word. He lead me to James 5:15: "And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well." Now, please keep in mind that the entire time that my faith is wavering, the faith of my 13-year daughter Nike has not been moved. There were people standing in the gap praying for her and her full recovery, but she didn't need anyone to stand in the gap for her because she never lost her faith. I continued to wonder if she was so sure of her recovery because she was a teenager and felt she was invincible like some many teenagers do or was it confidence from the faith she had in God and his word.

I truly started to believe in my heart that God's healing was already done and now we just have to do the work. He placed us on the right path and led us to Dr. Anthony Tufaro, Dr. Germaine-Lee and Dr. Sinada at the Johns Hopkins Hospital. These were the only doctors that knew about this type of tumor and were willing to treat her. Dr. Tufaro was her lead doctor and he was what they called a triple threat: he specializes in tumors, he is a surgeon, and a board-certified reconstructive surgeon. Dr. Tufaro felt that it would be best to have Nike get injections on a daily basis of a medicine called Calcitonin. This medication was used to treat others who have had this type of tumor. The purpose of the medicine was to shrink the size of the tumor, as well as to harden it, to make it easier to remove. After six months on the medication, the tumor had grown to twice the size it was originally and, at the point, we decided to go ahead with the surgery.

Nike had to have a special mouth piece made that would cover the large hole that would be left in the roof of her mouth so that she could talk, as well as teeth to replace the six that would be lost during the surgery.

In June 2008, the Metro Mass Choir ventured out into the streets of Washington, DC in an effort to reach the homeless community. Our intentions were to provide them food and a word of encouragement. An outing of this magnitude was the first opportunity to serve for many in our group as we had not had the opportunity to serve outside of our individual church homes. We approached the outing with apprehension, nervousness and lots of prayer. In our prayers we asked that someone may hear the news of Jesus Christ through us and be saved and encouraged. Little did we know, that we would be the ones to be richly blessed on this day. This was a personal challenge for me, as I am an introvert, certainly not the type to expose myself or be placed in a situation where I might feel vulnerable. I was a member of the choir and was simply “being a trooper for the team”. God knew what he had in store for me.

We went into the city and immediately men and women who were in need made a single file line to our coolers and began to thank us for food. We were overwhelmed. We had prepared approximately 30-40 sandwiches and did not have enough to supply the need that day. As a group we were disappointed to have to turn people away when the food ran out. Physical food, that is. The real food was yet to come. After

On August 1, 2008, Nike checked into the hospital still not scared and holding God to his word. Dr. Tufaro explained what he was going to do, explaining about the hole he was going to have to make in the roof of her mouth in order to remove the tumor. He then asked her if she had any questions for him, and she responded "Does the hospital have Nickelodeon and the Disney Channel?" Still no worries. After Nike was on the operating table and the nurse placed the oxygen stripe on her

finger, she looked at her hand and said "I need some lotion." She is on the table about to have major surgery and she was asking for lotion. She had God's favor, and she knew it. After what seemed like days, Dr. Tufaro came to the waiting area and said the surgery was a success. Her face was completely intact. She could see and speak and he did not have to cut the large hole in the roof or her mouth. He was able to remove the tumor in **one** piece by going through the upper lip and teeth and seal the cut, and she had all of her teeth. She didn't need the prosthetic piece that I had in my purse that was made for her.

Everything the doctor said was going to happen **didn't**. Dr. Tufaro's agenda did not come to pass, but God's agenda did. To look at Nike know you wouldn't know she ever had a tumor. She is now 14 years old, a freshman in high school and a cheerleader. She continues to sing in her church choir as well as the Nova Youth Ministry of Fine Arts. She held onto her faith, she believed, and she has been healed.

May God continue to bless us all.

In August we retreated back to the park. This time, I brought my 5 year old son along as I wanted him to experience giving. On this occasion we were better prepared with the quantity of food as well as various toiletry items (soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste, etc). We fed over 100 men and women in need that day.

Yet the spiritual food was what they craved. They anticipated us singing and began to even make song requests! They requested hymns that they remember being sung in their home churches and we were all richly blessed.


